Hard to believe but 2017 is coming to a close. As we are approaching our 25 year anniversary, we have so much to be thankful for at HopeWest.


- We have served more than 22,000 hospice patients and their families since we began in 1993.

This month's recipe from our Holiday Christmas Cookie Exchange was contributed by volunteer Mary Douglas.

OLD-FASHIONED PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES

2 ½ c. unsifted flour 1 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt 1 c. creamy or chunky peanut butter 1 c. Mazola Margarine 1 c. sugar 1 c. firmly packed brown sugar 2 eggs 1 tsp. vanilla

Stir first 4 ingredients and set aside. In large bowl with mixer at medium speed beat margarine and peanut butter until smooth. Beat in sugars until well blended and then add eggs and vanilla. Add flour mixture; beat until well blended. If necessary, chill dough. Shape into 1-inch balls. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten slightly and decorate with candied cherries or flatten with fork dipped in colored sugars. Bake in 350° oven for 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from cookie sheets and cool on racks. Makes about 6 dozen cookies.

Is your patient always asleep when you visit? Find a staff member to see if the patient should be awakened. Contact your social worker and see if the patient wants to be awake when you're there. They may be looking forward to your visit and doze off beforehand. If so, please attempt to wake them, ask if they'd like a visit and continue accordingly!

WEATHER

Please remember during this time of year to use caution when volunteering. If the roads are bad, please stay home. If you can't see your patient call them and let them know you need to reschedule. If you are working at one of the offices, call or email your supervisor to let them know that you are staying home. Your safety is important to us!
