The Art of Connection

Ronald's Journey to Hope & Healing



The home of HopeWest hospice patient, Ronald, is a vibrant gallery of outdoor photographs, etched scenes, and painted canvases.

It's a place where art spills from bins, adorns the walls, and scatters across the floor, each piece, striking and full of life, telling a unique story from within his journey. Ronald, with a pencil in hand, draws inspiration from photographs he's taken, transforming the images into stunning drawings that reflect his connection to the world around him.

In his youth, Ronald found that drawing allowed him to communicate with his sister who has learning disabilities. He would sit with her as they spent hours drawing and coloring, discovering that in the midst of silence art helped to overcome verbal barriers and create dialogue through pictures.

When severe back pain eventually became too great for Ronald to sit at his art table, his creative pastimes came to a halt. With no family living close by, the loss of his artwork left him visibly downtrodden. As other health issues arose, Ronald elected to receive hospice care with HopeWest, and his team eagerly went to work easing the life-limiting discomfort keeping him from his hobbies. With pain management tailored specifically to his needs, Ronald's care team soon had him back to the drawing table.

Shortly after joining the hospice program, Ronald reached out with a unique idea for sharing his talents. Thanks to the relationship with his sister, he knew art was a great communication tool, and with renewed energy he felt inspired to give back. Ronald connected with the HopeWest Kids team to create custom coloring and activity pages that can be used in counseling sessions and for special projects at summer camps. These pages are more than just activities; they are tools for healing, helping children navigate through their grief and loss when words are simply not enough.

Ronald's story is one of resilience, creativity, and the power of connection. It's about how, even in the face of life's unexpected turns, one can find new ways to express and share their gifts with the world. With the support of his care team and a new partnership with HopeWest Kids, Ronald has not only been able to reconnect with his passion, but also contribute to a larger story of hope and healing.

While it might seem simple, providing coloring pages for students to color on can be incredibly impactful. In many cases, when children or teens are struggling to communicate verbally, coloring is a way for them to express themselves and engage in their healing journey.



More than **560 children** and teens across the Western Slope participated in HopeWest Kids Grief programs; there were **530 adults** who found strength and comfort in HopeWest bereavement support groups; **250 palliative care patients** received help as they faced serious illness, and **2000 hospice patients** whose end-of-life medical, emotional, and spiritual needs were tended to by our dedicated care teams. As stunning as these numbers are in and of themselves, we never lose sight of the fact that behind each number is a family, a story, and a legacy.

In 2024, the Development Department will continue to raise funds to help sustain the transformational care HopeWest has delivered over our 30-year journey; we will also be launching a new initiative—the **Continuing Education Fund**. This commitment directly translates to higher quality of care and improved experiences for patients and families.

And Andrea, the patient's HopeWest social worker, collaborated with the VA to arrange for \$100 to grocery shop for the patient and restock his pantry, ensuring he always has something to eat on reserve.
